EXHIBITIONS AT MAG

ROBERT POLIDORI: CHRONOPHAGIA

Through July 24, 2016 in the Grand Gallery

Chronophagia (“the eating of time”) features 52 large-scale color photographs by Robert Polidori, who received his MFA from SUNY Buffalo in 1980. Polidori’s metier is examining built environments that have been altered by human or natural intervention—New Orleans in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina, Chernobyl as a post-disaster wasteland, the Middle East devastated by years of warfare, the palace of Versailles undergoing an extended renovation. Usually devoid of human subjects, these photographs are suffused with human stories waiting to be told. “Where you point the camera is a question,” he says, “and the image you get is a kind of answer.”

This exhibition was organized by the Faulconer Gallery, Grinnell College, from the collection of the artist. In Rochester, it is sponsored by the Gallery Council of MAG, Mr. & Mrs. William E. Cherry and the Rubens Family Foundation. KEITH HARING: APOCALYPSE

Through August 28, 2016 in the Lockhart Gallery

Artist and activist Keith Haring (1958–1990) first gained public attention during the early 1980s with anonymous graffiti drawings in the New York subway system. After a few high-profile commissions, his iconic imagery was appearing on everything from posters and T-shirts to coffee mugs and wine labels. His stated ambition was to break down the barriers between high and low art, much as his friend Andy Warhol had done. Always politically conscious, Haring used his fame and talent to heighten awareness of AIDS, apartheid and the crack cocaine epidemic, and became involved with several children’s charities. In 1988, shortly after he was diagnosed with AIDS, he collaborated with the Beat writer William Burroughs to create the Apocalypse portfolio. Haring’s provocative imagery and Burroughs’s stream-of-consciousness poetry create a vision of the HIV virus as a harbinger of the end of the world. The artist died two years later, at the age of 31.
