After retiring from MAG, Kelly continued using her knowledge and love of fine art and craft as director of Sonnenberg Gardens' Arts at the Gardens Show. She continues to serve the Show as artistic consultant.

Currently she is working with author Gail Windisch on a catalogue raisonne and exhibition of the history of Associated American Artists where her father, Sylvan Cole, served as director.
