

Learn to Draw!



The Creative Workshop is a place where anyone can learn to draw, and enjoy themselves in the process. The classes in winter 2012 below are excellent choices for beginners or those with more experience.

Art for Absolute Beginners

You'll find fun ways to make art, many of which will build your drawing skills. Offered on either Thursday evenings (32638) or Tuesday mornings (32639).

Beginning Drawing

You will learn to draw through structured exercises, lots of demonstrations, and helpful instruction. Each instructor introduces drawing in a fun, personalized- method designed to help you succeed. Offered Tuesday mornings (30323), Wednesday nights (30324) and Saturday afternoons (30325).

Drawing into Painting

This class starts with drawing exercises and then builds into a satisfying experience with either oil or acrylic paints. Students are frequently amazed at what they accomplish. Offered Monday evenings (32662).

Drawing Fearlessly!

Three hour crash- course designed to introduce drawing as a relaxing, relevatory process. Three different teachers teach this: each one will be a little different, and will work to push you past fear. Offered Wednesday Jan 18 afternoon (32642) or Thursday March 1 evening (32643).

Drawing at the Lamberton Conservatory

In this short three week class held in the conservatory in Highland Park, you'll learn to see plants better with the instruction and coaching of artists who often draw from nature. Offered Tuesday afternoons(32658).

Sketchbook Studio

Build a sketchbook as you learn to draw, doodle better, or otherwise record your unique world. Offered Saturday mornings (32646).

Drawing in the Galleries

Drawing directly in a sketchbook in the Memorial Art Gallery helps build drawing (and looking) skills. Offered Thursday evenings (32654) and Saturday afternoons (30326).

Portrait

You'll follow a step-by-step process to draw a portrait from a clothed model or plaster cast. The technique in this class stresses careful observation, and is well suited for lovers of classical art. Offered Thursday afternoons (32665).

Figure Drawing

This class introduces effective methods of drawing the nude model. Instructors coach students. Offered Tuesday evenings (32656).
