CIUDAD Y SUBURBIA: THE CHANGING NATURE OF LATINO IMMIGRATION

Latin American and Caribbean immigration to New York has dramatically changed the essence of New York and the nation. Are we becoming a bilingual/bicultural country?

This lecture examines Latino immigration, especially in New York and the northeast. In the past, Latino immigration meant establishing roots in cities. Recently, however, many immigrants sojourn in cities for a short time or bypass them completely by moving to the suburbs.

Sherrie Baver is Associate Professor of Political Science and Latin American Studies at The City College and The Graduate Center—City University of New York.
